## Saint Martin of Tours Pastoral Council

We are pleased to announce our newly established Pastoral Council. Parish Pastoral Councils exist in three quarters of the Catholic parishes in the United States. Our Council has been established according to the guidelines set by canon 536 of the Code of Canon Law, and as directed by the Bishop of San Diego. The purpose of the Council is to assist the pastor and pastoral staff in areas such as faith formation, pastoral planning, establishing goals and objectives, and planning special activities and events.

The Council is consultative and provides direction based on engagement with the larger parish community. Working together to create opportunities for parishioners to grow in their spirituality is our highest goal.

## How were Pastoral Council Members Chosen?

When we began planning for a Pastoral Council parishioners were invited to nominate themselves or someone else. All members either applied or were suggested by fellow parishioners. Each will serve for terms ranging from one to three years. Twelve members make up the core Council, but members of the pastoral staff, including the pastor and deacon, will also attend meetings.

There will also be representatives from the Finance Council and Liturgy Committee attending. The twelve core members reflect the parish population in gender, age, and culture in order to provide an opportunity for multiple perspectives when making recommendations for action. When current members leave their positions, new members will be selected by the Council in consultation with parishioners.

## What do Council Members Do?


Council members will act as lines of communication for parishioners and various ministry groups in order to better serve the needs of our parish community. Father Poulsen will serve as the president of the Council. Eileen Dial, our facilitator, will chair the meetings and create the agenda in consultation with Father Poulsen. Michele Travis has agreed to serve as secretary for the Council, and she will record minutes from the meetings in order to maintain a permanent record of the work done by the Council.


